LIQUOR PERMIT POLICY AND PROCEDURE

All members of The Company of Fifers and Drummers, (a.k.a. The Company) and all persons on The Company premises shall adhere strictly to the provisions of the Connecticut Liquor Control Act and the Connecticut Department of Consumer Protection regulations pertaining hereto. The Company shall maintain a copy of the statutes and regulations at The Company of Fifers and Drummers Headquarters and Museum (The Company Hall) at all times.

Alcoholic beverages can only be sold and/or consumed on the premises when The Company Hall is open to the public. All alcoholic beverages must be in a plastic cup.

Alcoholic beverages other than those purchased and maintained by The Company for the bar are strictly prohibited from the premises. Any attempt to do so is in direct violation of the Connecticut Liquor Control Act and jeopardizes The Company's good standing with the possible loss of its liquor license.

Alcoholic beverages sold at The Company Hall bar, shall not be removed from the premises by any person under any circumstance.

No person other than the scheduled bartenders and Liquor Policy Committee members (LPC), shall be permitted behind the bar when the bar is open.

No one under the age of 21 may sit directly at the bar.

Bartenders are prohibited from accepting personal gratuities for tending bar during any Company sponsored function. Any tips accepted shall be deemed donations and delivered to The Company Treasurer.

Bartenders on duty are prohibited from consuming alcoholic beverages.

Penalties for violations are as follows:

1. Loss of Company membership and/or prohibition from The Company's premises for serious violations.
2. Suspension of Company membership and/or temporary prohibition from The Company's premises for any person's violation of any provision of the Liquor Permit Policy.
3. Suspension of Company membership and/or temporary prohibition from The Company's premises and/or temporary prohibition from the purchases or consumption of alcoholic beverages on The Company's premises for any person's conduct that is contrary to or inconsistent with any provision of this Liquor Permit Policy.
